

Sharks Alive

The IMAX movie Sharks 3D packs a powerful conservation message.

Sharks 3D, the new IMAX film from director Jean-Jacques Mantello, does something no other film of its type has done before: It presents sharks in their natural environment and in all three dimensions. Never before (and no, Jaws 3D does not count) has a documentary enabled viewers to feel they're fully co-existing with these marine predators. Except for scenes with great whites, the film was shot without the protection of a cage.

Oceans activist Jean-Michel Cousteau was so impressed with Mantello's riveting imagery that he agreed to act as the film's presenter, promoting it—and its emphatic conservation message—across the globe. The 42-minute film addresses the crisis facing the "lions and tigers of the ocean," which have been overfished to the point of near extinction. "We are all connected," Cousteau warns of the threat posed to our ecosystem. "And we all depend on the oceans for the quality of our lives."
